MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF



2019 was a year of celebration for Chippewa Falls! This year we would celebrate our 150th year anniversary in style in our newest addition, Riverfront Park.

Our year started out with a very cold and snowy beginning. Record cold temps and snowfalls meant our officers were outside a lot in terrible conditions. In total our officers responded to 143 reportable crashes that winter. Chippewa Falls Mayor Greg Hoffman recognized the police department and other city departments for their outstanding job in 2019 in an official proclamation.

This year we experienced our first officer involved shooting in decades. This incident was investigated by the Eau Claire Police Department and reviewed by the Chippewa County DA and was determined to be justified. The suspect in this case was not killed and no officers or citizens were harmed.

On the personnel side we promoted Officer Sheridan Pabst to the rank of Sergeant. In 2019 we ran two hiring processes in one year for the first time. We hired Scott Schoenwetter, Christian LeMay, Noah Weinke, and Cody Richardson as our new officers. Also, Parking Enforcement Worker Jean Bernier celebrated 25 years with the department this year.

New officers are very hard to come by across the nation. Thanks to our rigorous hiring process we are still finding great people to join our team. The new union contract was completed before the end of the year with a pay increase for the officers. This should help with officer recruitment and retention in a very competitive employment market.

Looking into next year we as a department will to continue to partner with our community as we tackle key issues like mental health and methamphetamine abuse. Our department is actively engaged in the Take a Stand Against Meth campaign in Chippewa County. We will also continue our efforts along with the Chippewa Falls Area Unified School District to add a badly needed School Resource Officer to the Middle School.



 - Hear appeals of disciplinary actions initiated by the Chief of a Department



The male seemed unwilling to swim towards shore. Numerous Police and Fire units quickly responded and attempted rescue efforts by deploying life vests and ring buoys without success. The Fire Department's rescue boat was sent out with two EMT's and a police officer on board.

He floated past the railroad bridge near Wagner St. The rescue boat was able to reach him as he neared the area near Scout Island. At this point he was repeatedly going under water. Despite the danger, the EMT's and our officer were able to rescue him from the water and return him to shore safely


