Drug Abuse

Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle. During the stop sufficient cause was developed for a probation search. The search was conducted and the suspect was arrested for a DOC Warrant, Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Possession of Illegally Obtained Prescription.

OWI and Drug Abuse

Kwik Trip reported a subject left the store after stealing a case of beer and they wished to pursue charges. Officers conducted a traffic stop with the vehicle and contacted the driver. The officer suspected impairment and field sobriety testing was conducted. The driver was subsequently arrested for OWI-2nd offense. She was also arrested for Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Retail Theft, and Battery or Threat to Law Enforcement. She was issued a citation for operating without a valid license.

Juvenile Case

Caller reported an unattended 6-year-old entering her house and asking for food. Officers contacted the juvenile who was able to lead the officers to the trailer he has been staying in with his parents. Both parents were not on scene, and their whereabouts were unknown. The

child was transported to the Police Department, and DHS was contacted and arrived at the Police Department a short time later. The child's parents also arrived at the PD. DHS placed the child with grandparents. Investigation continues.

Criminal Damage

Caller reported two juveniles caused damage to the bathroom in Irvine Park near the Splash Pad. The toilet paper holder was broken, toilet paper stuffed in the toilet and screens popped off the windows. Juveniles were not located at that time. Caller called back while officers were busy as the juveniles were causing issues at Parkview. Later in the night a third call was received and the juveniles were located and identified. They admitted to the damage and were released to adults and warned for curfew. Officer have contacted the Parks Dept to see how they wish to proceed.
