Drug Abuse

Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with no plates driven by a male with two female passengers. The officer requested a K9 respond. LHPD K9 Kita positively indicated on the vehicle and various drug related items were located. The vehicle was left in the parking lot and the business owner was notified of the situation. The male was arrested for Possession of Methamphetamine and a Probation Hold Arrest. One female was arrested for Possession of THC (felony), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Possession of a Masking Agent, and a Probation Hold. The second female was arrested for Felony Bail Jumping.

Attempted Homicide

A male subject showed up to the PD lobby covered in blood. Officers learned of an altercation at 219 W. Grand Ave. Officers located a second male with severe injuries incapacitated on the living room floor in a pool of blood. This male was transported by EMS. The suspect was interviewed and arrested for aggravated battery. A search warrant was executed at the residence. Upon further investigation charges of attempted homicide were forwarded to the DA.

Check Object

Officers responded for a report of an overturned boat in the river between the bridge and the dam. Contact was made with two individuals who were near the shore and they advised they observed the boat floating down the river unoccupied and half full with water. Officers contacted all of the registered owners of vehicles that had a trailer parked at the boat landing. Multiple individuals in the area reported they did not see anyone in distress in the water. The boat was removed from the river and the registered owner was contacted. He advised that he had the boat on the bank of the Timber Terrace

Golf course and believed someone had pushed the boat off of the bank. There is no reason at this time to believe the boat had been occupied.
